Policies

The Faculty Council was formed in 1955 to administer school affairs during the illness of the principal, Mrs. Logie.

Now its functions are to consider matters that need not come before the entire faculty, and it acts as an executive committee for matters needing immediate attention.

Among its major actions taken this year were: ...pupils absent from class a total of 10 days without a medical certificate will not be permitted to sit for the final exams; ...because Burmese, English, Mathematics and any secondary language are basic, and because a failure of any of these subjects in any standard will prevent good work in that subject in a higher standard, a failure in any one of these subjects will prevent promotion; ...uniform examinations for all sections of the fourth standard as well as the fifth; ...all pupils in the G.C.E. sections will be required to take all subjects until the tenth standard when a choice will be permitted;

...children of Burmese citizens will not be excused from the study of the Burmese language;

...dishonesty in an ordinary examination will result in a failure in that subject for the term, and dishonesty, either in receiving or giving aid, in a final examination for the year will mean refusal of promotion.
